

Research Project
Post baccalaureate Pharm.D.

Postbaccalaureate Pharm.D. students must maintain an active registration each semester for the Research Project class. The first time a student registers for this course, he or she will register for PHA 7790 (Research Project – 4 credit hours). At the end of the semester, the student will be graded based on the following criteria:

If the student has:

1. completed the project successfully, including presentation, he or she will receive a passing grade (P)
2. not completed the project, but has made progress toward completion, he or she will receive a grade of Progress (PG)
3. not completed the project, and has not made any progress toward completion, he or she will receive a grade of No Progress (NPR)
4. failed the project (F)

If the student receives a grade of PG or NPR, he or she will need to register for PHA 7790C (Research Project – Continuation, 1 credit hour) each successive semester. This registration will provide access to email, library resources, faculty mentoring, etc. If the student does not register for Research Project – Continuation, access to these resources cannot be provided. Registration for PHA 7790C must continue until the student has successfully completed the project and a grade of P is obtained. Students submitting a final project that does not meet the course standards will receive a failing grade (F).

Do not register for this course until you are ready to work on your project (students must register for this course prior to going out on Advanced Practice Experiences and after all didactic (classroom based classes) have been completed). It is to your benefit to complete the project as quickly as possible. You will incur additional expenses for tuition and fees each additional semester that you register for PHA 7790C.

If your project is complete and you have only the presentation component remaining, please contact me via email outlining your plans to present.
