PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The PGY1 Community-Based Pharmacy Residency Program requires a full-time practice commitment and is a minimum of twelve months in duration. The program is offered by the Department of Pharmacy Services at Nova Southeastern University College of Pharmacy. It provides opportunities in a variety of community practice experiences within the NSU Clinic Pharmacy, an academic pharmacy open to the public. The resident will gain experience in pharmacy operations, direct patient care services, Medication Therapy Management (MTM), and managed care activities. The department operates the ICUBAcares Pharmacist Advocate Program where the resident will participate in formulary management, patient adherence, MTM, and prior authorization strategies. The resident will also participate in both didactic and clerkship education of pharmacy students, obtain a teaching certificate, and conduct a research project. Additionally, residents are required to rotate through an ambulatory care learning experience at the Miami VA, an integrative pharmacy services clinic at NSU Pharmacy, and may complete an elective in either outpatient cardiology or mental health. The

program is designed around the resident's professional interests.
