## Program Purpose

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY2) pharmacy residency training.

The PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency Program at Nova Southeastern University (NSU) is designed to prepare pharmacists to provide high quality patient care in diverse clinical settings. Pharmacists completing this program will be provided with diverse experiences to become independent clinical practitioners, educators, and leaders in the pharmacy profession.

## Program Overview

This 12-month program offers experiences in acute care, academia, ambulatory care, administration, quality and medication safety. The pharmacist will have the opportunity to provide team-based care to various patient populations, educational seminars and didactic lectures, quality improvement projects, research, and leadership roles.
